Exceptional Care in Extraordinary Times

In response to the COVID-19 global pandemic, Mercy reacted immediately by staffing a 24/7 informational hotline, creating five screening clinics, rapidly deploying telemedicine services, and investing \$12.5 million in the construction of a 32-bed critical care unit in The Mary Catherine Bunting Center to expand hospital bed capacity in the State of Maryland. Mercy has served the community by conducting COVID-19 tests on 174,362 patients, vaccinating over 21,500 patients, and providing care and services to thousands of COVID-positive patients from July 1, 2020–June 30, 2021.
